This classy, practical basket with "Bling" embellishment (included) begins with a 10" x 14" D handle inserted into a 6"x10" oval wood base. Learn this diamond design using start/stop rows, how to lace a round reed rim filler using waxed linen above the rim and this fun wrapped handle design. MARLENE MEYER

Learn how to triple twine with round reed and flat reed. The pattern looks like a twill. There will be choice of flat reed colors with leather to match. Embellishment is included in class. Approx.4"x9" oval base x 6"H Advanced Beginner/Intermediate Class, prep & material fee \$60 Special tools: awl, glue

VARIATIONS

PAM MILAT

A double wall reed basket that is all natural on the inside and features varying shades of color on the outer wall. Students will use the over/under, triple twine, and a Japanese weave to complete the inner and outer walls of this rectangle to oval basket. The basket is then finished off with double lashed, color filled rim. Colors are shades of teal, aqua, green, and blue. Approx. 10" x 7" x 6"H Intermediate Class, prep & material fee \$75

NAUTICAL EDGE MARY PRICE

This nautical themed basket is woven using natural and dyed gray reed. Techniques include: inserting natural spokes into a round wood base, double triple twine, creating double wave embellishments and a single lashed rim with cotton cord rim fillers and handles. Nattia is all about drama. Begin with a 5" acrylic bloom base in shades of purple and blue. Round reed spokes will be secured with twining and 4 rod wale. Sides capture the attention with "ribbon spokes" that also play an important role in the creation of the "circle" border. Some unique round reed techniques will be discussed and utilized as well as traditional weaving methods. Approx. 8 ³/₄" D x 5"H Intermediate/Advanced

You will learn to form your own handles and wrap with color and chair caned crosses. The rim lacer features Godseyes on each side. You will create these 2 flowers with button centers for your embellishment. *Please specify color choice.* Pictured in "2 shades of green" – also available in "2 shades of blue" or "black and smoked". Experiment with this cathead, starting with the weaving options (continuous, weave and chase, or start/stop). For rim, you can use palm fronds(pictured), leather, birch bark <u>(choose when registering)</u>. Cathead techniques will be discussed and you can use some of my hot tips for beautiful cathead shape. SEVIAH SUSAN BAXTER

Seviah is based on a 4" acrylic bloom base and introduces some of the "FUN" damentals of round reed weaving. Twining will be used to secure the spokes and then 3-rod wale takes the stage. Using different colored reed will produce a "becoming" design on the sides. How color and spoke count can create different designs will be discussed as well as the flexibility of round reed borders. The basket is a great size for keys, remotes, fruit or anything that has a tendency to "get lost". It also makes a great gift for those people difficult to shop for. This useful basket starts with a wood base. Students twine the bottom to reach 12". The sides are woven with natural and dyed reed. A perfect basket for any table setting. HOLIDAY GNOME BROOM

Utilizing a gnarly wood stick as the handle, students use natural broom corn to construct a hearth broom that is totally useful. Embellish this broom to create a unique Holiday Gnome. Various hats, as well as holiday embellishments will be available to create a one of a kind broom gnome that will make you smile. Approx. 24-30" long <u>All Levels</u> Class, prep & material fee \$69 <u>Special tool:</u> Hot glue gun --- no broom tools needed

Insert dyed and natural spokes into a rectangular wood base. Along with start/stop weaving, learn to descend rows to build up front and back height. Insert a pair of flat topped swing handles & learn unique chair caned overlay "Infinity" design of triple X's in the center. A variety of colors will be available with liners at additional cost. INFINITY SWING

Students will use a rectangle octagon (polygon) base to start. Weave and chase up the sides with dyed reed with options for colors. The rim is a thick piece of birch bark on the outside and inside for stunning effect. You may use an embellishment on the rim if desired. Approx. 6" x 4" octagon base <u>Advanced Beginner</u> Class, prep & material fee \$55 <u>Special tool:</u> glue

In honor of Eliza Pinckney who introduced and cultivated the indigo plant in SC in the mid 1700's (think blue jeans), this small Native American patterned basket is woven with indigo dyed reed. Students weave the side pattern from a color block chart. Not everyone will complete the blanket stitched lashed rim during class time but will have materials and instructions to do so independently. Approx. 6" x 6" x 4"H <u>Intermediate</u> Class, prep & material fee \$50 <u>Special tools</u>: 2-3 cloth spoke weights; 24+ gator clips with teeth; tapestry needle

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Learn to create waves of color using 8 different jewel tones of dyed flat oval reed on a 10" round slotted wood base. Students will learn 4 rod wale with a step up, continuous twill weave in natural flat oval reed, 2 layers of colorful waves, and finish with a folded matchstick rim. Approx. 11"D x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "H <u>All levels</u> Class, prep & material fee \$60

Please evaluate your skill level not only for your total weaving experience, but also for your experience in the techniques offered in the class you are considering.

Advanced Beginner

Weavers are becoming proficient in basic weaving techniques including over/under weaving, start/stop weaving, twining, and rim lashing. They are learning to control shape. They will be introduced to new pattern weaves such as twill, different twining methods, and rim and handle finish variations. If you are taking a class in a material you have never used, you are a beginner in that class.

<u>Intermediate</u>

Weavers are gaining proficiency in weaving techniques. They have no trouble setting up bases, twining, over/under weaves and rims using the materials offered for a class.

<u>Advanced</u>

Weavers are proficient or have mastered weaving techniques. They are ready to take on more challenging projects. Teachers depend on students to have achieved this skill level to attend their class. Basic skills are not reviewed due to time constraints.

You are invited to enjoy a wonderful experience of basket weaving with warm and friendly people at the Minnesota State University Southeast, Winona MN Campus. Very talented and experienced teachers have been invited to instruct and share their talents. Come join us for 3, 2, or even 1 day of relaxation and fun! We look forward to seeing you again to renew old friendships, or meeting you for the first time to create new ones.

Overnights rooms will be available at Winona State's Kirkland-Haake Res Hall -263 W. Mark Streethttps://www.winona.edu/housing/kirkland-haake.asp on the corner of Huff St & Mark St. These are air conditioned rooms (although you may want to bring a small fan). Winona State is an alcohol and smoke free facility. It is a short drive from the classes. We have suites with 4 separate bedrooms, 1 bathroom, shower room, and double vanity. These are sleeping rooms with bed, desk and chair – and an empty "living room". There is no sitting area in the suites, however each floor has a small shared kitchen area and lounge which can be used for gatherings in the evening. **You may want to bring your own laptop/ipad for music and movies, Kleenex, cups, fitted sheets (XL Twin) if you want, extra blankets and extra towels if you want them. You will be provided a towel, washcloth, 2 flat sheets, 1 thinner blanket, and 1 pillow. THERE IS A MAX OF 4 PEOPLE PER SUITE –We have limited number of suites, so will need to assign as many 4 persons to a suite as possible. Cost will be \$45 each per night if 4 to a suite. If 3 to a suite - \$60 per person; if 2 to a suite \$90 per person. If you are planning to room with friends please indicate their names, and if you don't know of others staying overnight, Deb will try to match you up with someone. If we don't have 4 people available to put in a suite, you will be required to pay the higher cost. We will do our best to assign people to keep the cost down.**

Check-in times will be sent to you when confirmations are mailed. Area hotels are listed below if you prefer those accommodations. You are encouraged to make your hotel registration early – there are several other area events during our timeframe. Registration is by mail only.
